FAQs for Sailing School 2020

- **Groups will be no larger than 5 campers** and will have little contact with other groups.
- **No Outside Vendors including food service.** Students must bring their own lunch.
- **Campers and Staff will wear masks as per CDC guidelines.** Activities will be outside and implement social distancing to limit the need for masks.
- **We encourage** wearing a bathing suit to camp to limit the need for changing mid day.
- **Items to bring include:** a backpack with a bathing suit, a zip lock bag for wet clothes, a change of clothes, suntan lotion, a mask, lunch for the day, and a water bottle. ALL swimsuits and towels must be taken home every day to be laundered.
- **Time will be given in between activities to allow staff and campers to sanitize.**
- **Visitors and Tours:** For the safety of our staff and campers, no visitors or tours will be allowed on park grounds during the summer.
- **Transportation:** Based on expected physical distancing requirements, we will not be offering transportation to and from camp this summer. Campers must be picked up and dropped off at appropriate camp locations each day.
- **Label your child's clothing, backpack, and other items.**

Inclement Weather

- **Sailing School will close when weather may force us inside** for the day as NO ACTIVITIES may take place inside. We are including 5 “makeup days” that will take place August 17 – August 21. More than 5 “makeup days” will result in a park district credit for the day in question.
- When possible, we will make a decision to close camp for the day as early as possible, but in the case of a midday storm or unforeseen hot afternoon, all families must be able to pick up their child(ren) within a moments notice.



Protective Protocols for 2020

To make the summer camp experience a safe and fun one, we need your cooperation and assistance. The following steps are necessary to ensure a safe environment for campers and staff.

Camper Screening-

- One week prior to camp starting, families must complete a COVID-19 Pre-Screening questionnaire. If any camper answers yes to any of the questions, we encourage them to take an Antigen test (a test for ACTIVE INFECTIONS) for COVID-19 before starting camp.
- If a camper tests positive before starting camp, then that camper must quarantine for 14 days prior to being admitted to the camp program. Each case must be individually reviewed by the camp nurse before the camper can enter our program.
- Campers will be greeted each morning by a staff member who will ask the parent/guardian if the child has had a cough, fever, or shortness of breath in the last 72 hours. If the answer is yes, the camper will NOT be allowed to attend camp until they have been symptom free for at least 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medication.
- The staff member will take each child's temperature at arrival of camp. If a temporal scan indicates the camper's temperature is above 100.0 F, parent/guardian will be asked to pull vehicle out of check in car-pool line and given option for staff to provide secondary standard thermometer temperature reading. If parent/guardian does not elect a second reading, or if the second reading registers over 100.0 F, the camper will NOT be allowed to attend camp until they have been symptom free for at least 72 hours without the use of fever reducing medication.
- If child with indicated temperature over 100.0 F has siblings enrolled in camp, then siblings will also not be permitted to attend for indicated time parameters listed above.
- **NOTE: Parents must wear masks at drop-off and pick-up. Parents may not exit the vehicle. No exceptions.**
- **Campers are not required to wear masks, unless in situations that require it per CDC guidelines.**
- **In certain circumstances, a doctor's note may be required to return to camp.**

Staff Screening-

- Staff will be trained on all policies and procedures during pre-camp training.
- All staff will be required to complete a health check/symptom screening questionnaire during pre-camp training.
- Daily staff health and temperature checks will be administered upon arriving to camp locations. Staff will be sent home at any signs of illness or fever.
- Face coverings and PPE will be used per CDC guidelines.
- In certain circumstances, a doctor's note may be required to return to camp.

Medical Forms

- **NO CHILD WILL BE PERMITTED TO ATTEND CAMP WITHOUT A COMPLETE HEALTH HISTORY.**
- **ONLY EPIPENS AND ASTHMA INHALERS ARE PERMITTED TO BE ADMINISTERED DURING THE CAMP DAY.**
- Medications **MUST** be dropped off with Sailing Directors on your child's first enrolled day of camp.
- All medications require authorization forms to be completed by a doctor and then dropped off along with the medications.
- Medication must be in the original pharmaceutical container with a pharmacy label, including the child's full name, address, prescriber's name, directions and expiration date.
- Medication for summer 2020 should expire after 8/21/20.
- All medications can be picked up on your child's last day of camp.

COVID-19 Pre-Screening Protocol and Form

- One week prior to camp starting, families must complete a COVID-19 Pre-Screening questionnaire. If any camper answers yes to any of the questions, we encourage them to take an Antigen test (a test for ACTIVE INFECTIONS) for COVID-19 before starting camp. **The form can be found on our website.**
- If a camper tests positive before starting camp, then that camper must quarantine for 14 days prior to being admitted to the camp program. Each case must be individually reviewed by the camp directors before the camper can enter our program.
